Part B. CV SUMMARY (max. 5000 characters, including spaces)

Prof. Dr. Antonio BAR CENDÓN (Spanish national) is Professor of Constitutional Law and Jean Monnet Professor 'ad personam' of European Union Law and politics at the Faculty of Law, University of Valencia, Spain. He has a degree in Law from the University of Santiago de Compostela, Spain, and



a doctorate in Law from the University of Zaragoza, Spain. He also took courses of political science at Harvard University, US, and at the European University Institute, Florence, Italy (where he was '*Jean Monnet Fellow*').

He has been Professor of Constitutional Law at the Universities of Santiago de Compostela, Zaragoza, Cantabria, and Valencia, in Spain. He has also been visiting professor and guest lecturer at several foreign centres, including Harvard University, US; University of Cambridge, UK; Institute for European Studies, Vrije Universiteit Brussel, Belgium; Universiteit Maastricht, The Netherlands; The Hebrew University, Jerusalem, Israel; Chinese National School of Administration, Beijing, China; Texas A&M University, Texas, US; Universidad Externado, Bogotá, Colombia; Universidad de Chile, Universidad de Concepción, Universidad de Valparaíso, Chile; Centro Superior de Estudios de la Defensa Nacional, España; Academia Nacional de Estudios Políticos y Estratégicos, Chile; Institut für Staatsorganisation und Verwaltungsreform, Bundeskanzleramt Österreich, Vienna, Austria. Between 1997 and 2002 he was a member of the European Institute of Public Administration (EIPA), Maastricht, The Netherlands, where he was Professor of EU law, EU policies and institutions, and Director of Research. He was also Vice-Rector of the University of Cantabria, and Director of the Department of Public Law. In 2004, he was appointed by the European Commission Jean Monnet Professor of Constitutional Law of the EU, and in 2013 Jean Monnet Professor "*ad personam*". In 2019 he was appointed '*Emeritus Professor*' by the University of Valencia, Spain (present position).

His research activity includes 24 projects financed by different institutions – both Spanish and foreign. Seven of these projects were conducted within the span of the 10 years marked by the call. He has published 120 works in the fields of his specialisation, including 11 books, published in Spanish, English, French, Italian and Catalan languages. 42 of these works were published within the span of the 10 years marked by the call. This extensive research activity has meant that the Comisión Nacional Evaluadora de la Actividad Investigadora has evaluated as 'positive' the quality of six periods of six years of research production – the maximum possible.

He is also a regular contributor to Spanish and foreign media – both written and audio-visual – on various subjects, including Spanish and EU law and politics, fundamental rights, democracy, rule of law, and international relations.

As a consultant, he has worked on numerous projects for the Government of Spain, the European Union (European Parliament, European Commission) and the Council of Europe (International Institute for Democracy), in several Central and Eastern European countries, in the Balkans and in the Mediterranean basin. He was the legal advisor and co-director of the EU project to assist in the process of establishment and election of the Palestinian Authority (1994-1996) and, in 2005, he was a member of the International Advisory Group that assisted the Constitutional Commission of the Iraqi National Assembly in the drafting of the Iraqi Constitution of that year. He is an expert advisor to the European Commission (DG Education and Culture; DG Research and Innovation) and a member of the expert committee of the Research Executive Agency, and of the Education, Audiovisual & Culture Executive Agency, of the EU, and of the Agencia Nacional de Evaluación y Prospectiva of the Spanish Government. He is currently a member of the Valencian Bar Association and a member of the European Commission's Team Europe.

Concerning the relevance and contribution of his research production to the generation of knowledge and innovation, it is difficult to choose and highlight only a few publications among such an extensive production, being the dimension of this scientific production a relevant merit on itself. In general terms, his research production could be divided in four main areas: *a)* institutional studies – including national and comparative constitutional issues –; here, his early and innovative studies on the Spanish the Government and on the Spanish parliament must be underlined. *b)* European Union studies – including political and economic governance, and policy issues –; here, his early and innovative studies on the EU economic governance and on the Brexit problem must be underlined. *c)* Fundamental rights and values' studies; here, his works on the fundamental rights and values shined in both the Spanish Constitution and the EU Treaties must be highlighted. And *d)* historic studies, referred mainly to governance issues; in this field, his studies on the Constitution of the Second Republic and on the 1812 Constitution must be mentioned.
